Consent Agenda

Councilor Uffelman made a motion to approve Consent Agenda as presented. Motion seconded. No discussion on motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Visitors, Appearances and Requests:

A. Public Appearances

Mayor Roppe asked the new Parks & Recreation Director to come forward and introduce himself.

Richard Bonine came forward and provided some background information on himself.

No one else came forward.

Councilor Carr arrived at 6:35 P.M.

B. Bike Park Facilities Concept - Darlene Henderson/Seth Crawford

Darlene Henderson stated they began to pursue whether a bike park was feasible for our community and continued with a power point presentation.

Ms. Henderson explained after looking at several properties, they determined that property on Juniper St. owned by the city had all of the existing elements making it a first choice over the others.

There were questions regarding if they were looking for the land to be donated, and what the Parks & Recreation Department's position is.

Mr. Bonine explained that he believed it would be best to deed it to Parks & Recreation to be more successful in seeking grants.

There were questions regarding need for property for future storm water needs; whether the existing restroom facilities could support additional use; and if other property was considered other than public property.

There were comments regarding having a Real Estate Agent of record to provide information for these types of requests.

Mr. Crawford explained that he had hoped if possible, to get a decision by December 15th which is the Facebook grant application deadline.

Seth Crawford, Kim Kambak, Murial DelaVergne-Brown, Eric Rice all provided comments of support. Mr. Crawford also stated others that could not be in attendance were in support and submitted a letter of support from Wayne Looney.

C. Kristi Steber

Kristi Steber, Crook County Foundation Executive Director stated she wanted to follow up on the Council's workshop and handed out a proposed list of deliverables for the next phase of the feasibility study.

Mr. Forrester requested that Ms. Steber get the feasibility study information to Mr. Bonine of Parks & Recreation.

Mayor Roppe recommended another workshop on this.

Councilor Seley stated that the Council has identified several good uses in the community with limited funds to carry all of them out.

Councilor Carr agreed with Councilor Seley.

Eric Klann, City Engineer presented the staff report.

Mayor Roppe asked Councilor's if anyone would like to attend University of Oregon's Architecture School invitation to view their design of a data center. Councilor Beebe said he would like to go and would get back to Eric Klann or Mayor Roppe.
