# City Council Meeting Brief July 9th, 2019

## Additions to the Agenda

City Manager Steve Forrester announced that McCall Oil is here and will being doing an update under the first Visitors, Appearances and Requests on the agenda.

#### **Consent Agenda**

A. Regular Meeting Brief 6-25-19

Councilor Jungmann made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Motion seconded. No discussion on motion, motion carried.

#### **Visitors, Appearances and Requests:**

#### A. McCall Oil

Representatives from McCall Oil came forward. Tim Connelly provided some company history of McCall Oil and explained how they are a third generation company and explained how their location at the railroad on Lamonta was a good choice for them.

#### B. Crook County Health Dept. Youth Prevention Presentation – Olivia Cooper

Olivia Cooper, Youth Liaison went through some statistics on youth use of tobacco, e-cigarettes and marijuana in Crook County and referred to her handouts to council. Miss Cooper also handed out pictures of items that were confiscated from students this last year at her school.

Miss Cooper explained that they are seeking support from Council to pass an ordinance or require licenses from businesses that sell tobacco products.

Discussions continued regarding this would be a county jurisdiction action; what licensing would accomplish; the city not requiring business licenses from any businesses; age requirements being enforced by state law; who would be responsible for enforcement and citations; wanting the city to pass a similar ordinance to the county; and banning flavored tobacco products even to those legally of age to use.

## A. Intent to Award 2019 Paving Project – Scott Smith

Scott Smith, Street Superintendent presented the staff report explaining the areas in town that were included in the bids, which is for the rehabilitation of approximately 762,000 square feet of city streets.

Councilor Beebe made a motion to approve the intent to award the 2019 Paving Project to High Desert Aggregate and paving in the amount of \$744,830.00. Motion seconded. No discussion on motion. All in favor, motion carried.

#### **B.** Intent to Award 2019 Waterline Improvement Project – Mike Kasberger

Mike Kasberger, Asst. City Engineer presented the staff report stating that the project consists of improving water lines in four areas in the city and includes 54 service connections, and seven new hydrants.

Councilor Rodriguez made a motion to approve the intent to award the 2019 Waterline Improvement Project to SMAF Construction in the amount of 604,574.00. Motion seconded. No discussion on motion. All in favor, motion carried.
