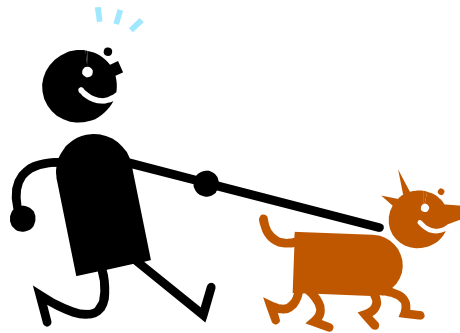

## Common Violations

- Dogs at Large (running loose, off-leash).
- Barking Dogs (continuous barking of 30 minutes or more).
- Unlicensed dogs within City Limits.
- Lack of Current Rabies Vaccination (updated every year or every 3 years).
- Dog Bites (both provoked and unprovoked).
- Lack of feces removal (doggy mess bags are available in most City Parks).

### DID YOU KNOW?

The fine for violating City Ordinance 90.01 may be up to **\$1000 per occurrence**. The issuance of a fine does not relieve the duty to correct the violation.



### DID YOU KNOW?

All dogs six months or older are required to have a **Dog License** and have current **Rabies Vaccinations**.

### A dog which meets any of the following conditions is considered a PUBLIC NUISANCE.

- (1) Disturbs any person by frequent or prolonged noises.
- (2) Roams about the city or runs at large.
- (3) Trespasses on property not owned by or under the control or custody of the owner or custodian of the dog.
- (4) Bites a person unless provoked.
- (5) Shows a propensity to bite persons.
- (6) Chases vehicles or persons.
- (7) Injures or kills an animal or fowl belonging to a person other than the owner or custodian of the dog.
- (8) Destroys or damages any property belonging to a person other than the owner or custodian of the dog.
- (9) Is a female dog in heat, and not properly confined.
- (10) Scatters garbage or trash.

### ARE YOUR PETS MICRO-CHIPPED?

Having a pet Micro-Chipped substantially increases the likelihood of that lost pet being reunited with its family.

Many Micro-Chips are about the size of a grain of rice, and can cost as little as a month's worth of food. Contact your local veterinarian for more information.
