Prineville Transportation System Plan Update Fall 2023

The Prineville Transportation System Plan (TSP)

is a plan to guide the City's future transportation system. It is a City document that will recommend programs, policies, and physical improvements to streets and sidewalks to address current and future transportation needs.

What does the TSP accomplish?

- Improves connections and safety for all people traveling in the City, including those who drive, walk, bike, use a wheelchair or cane, and deliver freight.
- Addresses dangerous conditions along U.S. 26 / 3rd Street to increase safety and reduce crashes.
- Updates the Prineville Travel Demand Model to better prioritize transportation improvements in high-demand areas of town.

What is happening so far?

- Identifying dangerous roadways and intersections in Prineville.
- Analyzing current traffic patterns and volumes.
- Drafting goals to guide projects, programs, and policies that will be included in the TSP.
- Draft goals center around:
 - Ensuring a safe transportation system.
 - Building a complete system of walking and biking routes.
 - Supporting economic development.
 - Promoting access to destinations.
 - Reducing the transportation system's impacts on Prineville's environment.

How to get involved

We are hosting an **Online Open House** and a **Street Network Survey** to share information and gather feedback on draft TSP goals and Prineville's existing conditions, including dangerous roadways and intersections. The survey will be open through **December 22**, **2023**.
