Bird of the Month - April Yellow-headed Blackbird





IDENTIFICATION

- Males black body with yellow head and white in wings
- Females charcoal body with dull yellow head
- They are often considered to have the worst bird song in North America

FOOD

Feeds mostly on insects and seeds gathered in marshes and farm fields

PREDATORS

 Adults are killed by raptors and feral cats. Juveniles can be eaten by raptors, herons, magpies, snakes and nest raiders like racoons and skunks. Surprisingly, the tiny Marsh Wren is a predator of baby Yellow-headed Blackbirds

BEHAVIORS AND FUN FACTS

- Habitat Breeds in wetland prairies and marshes
- Most winter in Mexico. Males and females often segregate into single sex flocks in winter
- Each male will gather a harem of up to 8 females in his territory.
 He will help raise his "first mate's" offspring but none of the others
- Often come to bird feeders during spring and fall migration
- Yellow-headed Blackbirds are one of the few birds whose genus and species names are the same (Xanthocephalus xanthocephalus). Xanthocephalus means "yellow-headed"
