## ORDINANCE NO. 665

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF COMMERCIAL PARKING PERMITS; REPEAL ORDINANCE NO. 621 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The people of the City of Prineville ordain as follows:

Section 1. That commercial parking permits be made available to carpenters, plumbers, electricians, painters, or other workmen who are required to park their vehicles in the area where parking meters are installed, or to owners of vehicles whose business requires frequent stops in the metered area for the purpose of picking up or delivering articles of goods or merchandise.

Section 2. That commercial parking permits issued to vehicles whose business requires frequent stops in metered areas shall be limited to // Hour in any metered area for the purpose of picking up or delivering articles of goods or merchandise.

Section 3. That application for a commercial parking permit shall be made to the City Recorder on a form which states the name and address of the applicant, the type of business in which the applicant is engaged, the purpose for which the parking permit is sought, and the license number of the vehicle on which the parking permit would be used.

Section 4. That a charge of \$20.00 per year, or \$10.00 for six months shall be made, for each commercial parking permit.

Section 5. That a commercial parking permit shall be used only for the purpose stated in the application for the permit, and use of a parking permit for personal purposes shall result in revocation of the parking permit. If a parking permit is revoked, there shall be no refund of the fee paid for the permit.

Section 6. Ordinance No. 621 and any other ordinance or ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. Inasmuch as it is necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the City of Prineville that this ordinance go into effect immediately after its passage, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.
