AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY LYING GENERALLY EAST OF SOUTH MAIN STREET AND SOUTH OF S. E. FIFTH STREET, CONSISTING OF TAX LOTS 10300 AND 10402 LOCATED IN THE S.W. 4, SECTION 5, T. 15S, R16E, ASSESSOR'S MAP 15-16-5C, CROOK COUNTY, OREGON, AND DISPENSING WITH A CITY ELECTION ON THE QUESTION OF ANNEXATION.

WHEREAS, there has been submitted to the City of Prineville a written petition for annexation to the City by more than half of the landowners who also own more than half of the land in the contiguous territory described below which real property therein represents more than half of the assessed value of all real property in the contiguous territory to be annexed; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 760 was passed, initiating the annexation of said territory, calling a hearing and directing that notice be given thereon, and since the hearing was held at which time all objections or remonstrances with reference to said proposed annexation were considered by the City Council and since that body feels that the annexation is to the best interest of the City and of the contiguous territory;

NOW THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Annexation Area.</u> The following described contiguous territory is hereby proclaimed to be annexed to the City of Prineville.

Tax lots 10300 and 10402 located in the S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 5, T15S, R16E, Assessor's Map 15-16-5C, Crook County, Oregon.

Section 2. Record. The City Recorder shall submit to the Secretary of State of Oregon (1) a copy of this ordinance, (2) a copy of the statement of consent of the landowners in the territory annexed, and (3) a copy of Ordinance No. 760 dispensing with an election in the City on the question of annexation. The City Recorder shall also send a description by metes and bounds, or legal subdivisions, of the new boundaries of the City within ten (10) days of the effective date of annexation to the Crook County Assessor and Crook County Clerk.
