ORDINANCE NO. 783

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE FIXING OF SEWER USER CHARGES AND CONNECTION FEES FOR THE USE OF THE SEWER FACILITIES OF THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 740, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 772 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Wherefore, because of increased operating costs of the City of Prineville's public sewer system, it is deemed to be in the public interest to raise sewer user and connection fees accordingly.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE, OREGON, ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

 $\underline{Section~1}.$ The City of Prineville, Oregon does hereby establish the following monthly rates and charges for the use of the sewage facilities of the City of Prineville in accordance with the schedule hereunto attached, marked Exhibit "A" and made a part thereof.

Section 2. The City of Prineville, Oregon does hereby establish the following connection fee schedule for use of the sewage facilities of the City of Prineville in accordance with the schedule hereunto attached, marked Exhibit "B" and made a part thereof.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 740 duly enacted by the City Council on the 26th day of November 1974, is hereby amended and modified as to any portion thereof that is inconsistent with the terms of this ordinance.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effective immediately after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
